

The rules of our association are to use your allotted stencil number you are required to be a member of this association. Unfortunately due to some confusion on this rule this has not been adhered to in a few cases. If you know someone using a stencil number that is not a member, have a quiet word to them about joining. In some cases stencil numbers in the Catalogues have been wrong or not put in, we are working with the brokers to correct this. We must do our part by putting stencil numbers on the specification and if someone else is filling in the specification ensure that they include your number. Also remember if you are going to be considered for a merit award nomination you need the stencil number on the specification.
